The Greek word for lose heart comes from two words combined – evil plus not. It means to not give into _____.

- Losing heart means that we cave into evil by refusing to live by faith in the character and promises of God (Hebrews 11:6).
- Losing heart means that we stop fixing our eyes on Jesus the author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2).

Many lose heart because they are confused about the nature of this life. We expect an idyllic life with little opposition. We can reduce our faith to slogans, sayings and easy answers to everything. This approach will set us up to lose heart. The journey of life is a battle between light and darkness. Satan uses underhanded, disgraceful means to twist the Word of God to darken people’s mind. The Bible refers to the Devil as, “the author of confusion.” (I Cor. 14) If we fail to realize this truth, we will walk into a battle thoroughly unprepared. We will be greatly disappointed when our misguided expectations of the Christian life crumble before our eyes.
